- Drop in to learn about the Queen Street Transit Master Plan and Downtown Mobility Hub study.
- Provide your input for identifying opportunities and challenges for travelling along Queen Street, and within the Downtown Mobility Hub Area (approximately 800 metres from the Brampton GO Station).
- Help us develop a vision for Queen Street by providing input on options for improving how people get around including walking, cycling, transit, driving, and for urban design and planning of the Downtown Mobility Hub.
- Visit the various information stations and share ideas for how improving transit will contribute to building a future ready Brampton.

The Study

The City of Brampton has initiated a Transit Master Plan (TMP) for Queen Street between McLaughlin Road and Highway 50 (east City limit). The purpose of the TMP is to support all transportation modes (including walking, cycling, transit and automobiles), connect people to places, and move goods to market. The study will recommend a high order transit technology, alignment, and configuration for Queen Street and the Downtown Mobility Hub while integrating with land use planning, urban design, and active transportation.

The Process

This study will follow Approach 1 of the master planning process described in the Municipal Engineers Association's Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in 2007 and 2011). The project will involve transit planning, active transportation, urban design, and land use planning that will incorporate BRT or LRT options. The Master Plan process will satisfy Phases I (Identify Problem and Opportunity) and II (Identify and Evaluate Alternative Solutions to the Problem or Opportunity) of the Municipal Class EA process.
