1.	<p>Downtown Art & Mural Project:</p> <p><i>Phase 1- Art Prints in McKinney Lane:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Presented a proposal on Tuesday to DBBIA BOD, going to start with phase one with art work in McKinney Lane Have received approval from the two landlords in McKinney Lane to do an art installation The goal is to have it up as soon as possible with art work by Brampton artists The art work will be removable at the request by the landlords Have received quotes from multiple printing companies, and will be going with Print Three DBBIA will be sharing art work with City of Brampton Action: Set up a meeting to review artwork that can go into McKinney Lane <p><i>Phase 2- Mural in Downtown:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mural has been postponed, want to have the highest standard of work DBBIA had a co-op student in the fall 2019 do research on murals in downtowns DBBIA have been looking for areas in the downtown that are mural friendly Have been looking at different laneways, there are a lot of factors to go with murals, size, and location Have a committee to review and judicate the mural content <p><i>City of Brampton Public Art Policy:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Action: Ask for V.Mountain to Receive guidelines from the City of Brampton for artwork displayed in public places 	<p>S.Godefroy</p> <p>L.Lukasik</p>
2.	<p>Recovery & Reopening Plans:</p> <p><i>Downtown Brampton Farmers' Market:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> City of Brampton has been working with Public Health on what type of model can be done for this summer Working with the details of what Public Health will allow City of Brampton City of Brampton is still awaiting approval for an online market, will update DBBIA when they hear back The Farmers' Market is operating no cost to the farmer's this year Public Health will not allow a on-street Farmers' Market, once there are five people it is consider an event 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cannot operate with the final approval of Public Health, right now they are only approving online markets • With online market the City of Brampton will be taking care of payments, and organizing orders • Right now, the goal is to try and support the farmer's and bring fresh produce to residents • Plan is to start with online market, and be able to pivot the model if/when restrictions are lifting for the Farmers' Market • Only items that are allowed to be sold at the online market is food • Brampton is the hot spot at the moment in Peel for COVID-19 • The physical layout would have to be different if approved for a street market, there are a lot of considerations, only one entrance and one exit, with room for consumers to line up • The City of Brampton has looked at multiple models, in regard to have a physically distance market that Public Health will allow <p><i>Downtown Brampton Outdoor Patio Program:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Following Board of Directors meeting, presented a proposal to close main and Queen St to create a park like piazza, and create an outdoor foot print for retail and restaurants to have a patio space • Councillor Medeiros and Santos have passed a motion to put forward road closure for patios, as well as a motion for patios City wide • Still need to allow pedestrians to walk, in Barrie there is a wood structure to extend patio onto the sidewalk • Zoning by-law requires a number of parking spots for all commercial businesses in the area • Need to have a plan in place for when City of Brampton is able to go into Phase 2 • Planning, building, and zoning issue, patio extension is about safe distancing • Action: City of Brampton start creating a checklist, on how businesses can apply to have an outdoor patio when able to move into Phase 2 • Action: DBBIA get an idea of what the restaurants want for patio 	<p>P.Aldunate S.Godefroy</p>
<p>3.</p>	<p>Sharps Pilot Project- Region of Peel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Report went to council about having sharps container placed in hot spots, and public areas • The sharps container is a pilot program for a year, the Region of peel will be paying for it, and maintaining the containers • There needs to be education and communication of where these bins are located for the public and homeless to dispose of sharps properly • Locations of containers: 8 Nelson Street transit facility, the Four Corners library, 16 John St visitor's lobby, there will be one in the three parking garages, Harmsworth Lane , Vivian Lane, and 	

	<p>McArter Lane, Regeneration Outreach, Regeneration thrift store, Knights of Columbus , and a wall mount in McKinney Lane</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DBBIA will wait to send out info on pilot project until City of Brampton staff sends out a communication plan
